## CHANCELLOR SUPPORTS OUR PENSION PROVIDER AFTER A FURTHER £25m BOOST

The company's promise in our last issue to pay off the Pension Fund deficit was confirmed in a statement sent to all members in June outlining the three year reduction plan. Now high profile trading and investment announcements this month will give our pensioners further reassurance.

A visit to Hull by Chancellor of the Exchequer George Osborne, pictured right, accompanied by Reckitt Benckiser chief executive Rakesh Kapoor spotlighted

a big new R&D investment in the Dansom Lane site and this, together with an encouraging half-year report, is reported on P6.

Pension Fund trustee Kevin O'Berg, the Reckitt Benckiser Pensioners' Association representative, says the healthy state of the company, coming on top of the extra effort put into the analysis and planning following the 2013 actuarial valuation, is all good news.

### The three year valuation

Every three years there is a detailed actuarial valuation of the RB Pension Fund to ascertain whether there are sufficient assets in the Fund to pay the liabilities as they arise.

The valuation carried out at April 2013 revealed that there was a deficit in assets of £124.6 million.

To make good this shortfall, the company (RB) has made a payment of £52.5 million in 2013 and will make further payments in 2014, 2015 and 2016 of £25 million.

### £230m paid in by 2016

Together with payments made following the April 2010 valuation, RB will have paid £230 million into the Fund by 2016.

Thus the Company continues to support the Fund despite the difficult economic situation over the last few years.

Kevin notes that having a financially strong sponsoring company provides reassurance to pensioners that their income is secure.



RB laboratory staff in Hull had been told a VIP was expected – but not who. ## HISTORIC ARCHIVES THAT SURVIVED THE 1941 BLITZ

In his foreword to Barrie Barnes' book *Reckitt's Heritage* archivist Gordon Stephenson wrote: "With the 'war to end wars' looming in the summer months of 1914, an outbreak of patriotic fervour swept the nation and it was by no means uncommon for a large proportion of the workforce from establishments such as Reckitt's to answer the call to arms and hasten to serve their King and country.

"What is perhaps unusual is that, almost a century later, much of what became of so many of those gallant men and women can still be traced in a variety of sources which somehow managed to escape the ravages of another major conflict in the 1940's.

"The author began his research for this book in the



In the past decade the role of the Reckitt factory in WWI has, as shown on the left, been the subject of a specially researched and written book and part of the nationally televised Remembrance Day service – but for *Contact* readers, and indeed all Reckitt people, the 1919 special issue of *Ours* which digital technology enables us to reproduce with this issue is probably the most emotive.

Our headline, taken from the *Remembrance* issue text, says it all. This simple document is about the people (owners and workers) in a community, and society, they jointly created and would give all to defend.

Basically, it is just a list. A list, yes, of the fallen; but also of everyone else who served. The who and the why; but distinctly no glorification or triumphalism. More disbelief and true belief. Disbelief in the need for war and its unacceptable human cost, underwritten by unshakeable belief in the kind of people they were and what they stood for.

Our Pensioners' Association could not now afford to print and post such a 50-page booklet with its board covers and hand-tied cord binding. Copies will survive in archives and libraries and, if there's one in your family collection, treasure it.

Our digital supplement is for the present generation and posterity. We hope former Reckitt people with no current link but a century-old family interest will be able to access it and, if you know any of our pensioners who are not on the internet, please, if you can, let them see it.

*Remembrance* was published before the listed Dansom Lane memorial was built but the Workpeople's memorials are recorded. Some are saved in the Heritage Centre.

offices of the firm which employed the subjects of his study. Despite the blitz on the night of 18th July 1941 which knocked out large portions of Kingston Works, most of the Company's historic archives survived.

"I had the pleasant task of making these available to Barrie and was greatly impressed by the enthusiasm with which he went about his task. It came as no surprise to me to learn that he decided to extend his search into other areas where he might track down the part played by each and every one of Reckitt's participants in the Great War. His inquiring mind led him to discover other major collections of war records and, to complete the picture, he set about tracing living descendants of those who took part.

"The result of Barrie Barnes' attention to detail is that here we have in a single volume a lasting memorial to those many citizens of Hull who, employed by the city's largest industrial employer at the time, were called upon to face untold tribulations in a conflict the like of which had never been known before and who, in so many instances, paid the ultimate sacrifice.

"This work will serve posterity well in allowing generations as yet unborn to bear witness to the hardships and sacrifices undertaken on their behalf by their very kith and kin."

*The Aumonier-designed Dansom Lane war memorial was the focus of a special service shared, left, on the BBC's live TV broadcast of the national November 11, 2008 Remembrance Day Service at the Cenotaph in London's Whitehall. On this 90th anniversary of the ending of WWI the broadcast included the nearby Garden Village and is still viewable on our website.*

When Dansom Lane, by then the factory's private approach road, was upgraded in 2009 its WWI "street shrine", one of only four left in Hull, was carefully restored and re-installed. Author Barrie Barnes (right in the picture), who had meticulously studied the shrine and the names on it for his *Known to the Night* book, was at the unveiling with archivist Gordon Stephenson.

In the same community spirit which motivated the workpeople's memorials, it covered more than just the factory and was incomplete when installed in 1916, missing several names which are now on the company memorial further along the lane. Many memorial listings are now accessible on media and other websites including national lists at the National Archives, whose logo is on the left of our headline, and the British Legion, whose logo is right, above.



## LESSER KNOWN FACTS

When war broke out, 113 Army and Navy reserves, Territorials and Ambulance Men attached to the Royal Army Medical Corps joined the colours. A special Works Company was formed, attached to the 4th Batt. East Yorks. Regiment.

\* \* \*

The directors decided to supplement the service pay of married men, making up the difference between the Army pay and wages earned at work every week after the men went to the front.

\* \* \*

The Remembrance Roll of Honour lists people by name, rank, regiment, unit, department in which they worked, and the date they joined the company.

\* \* \*

In addition to Kingston Works, Canister Works and Morley Street Works there are listings for Outside Staff, London House, Bluebell House, Liverpool House, Plymouth House and Dublin House.


The company was also international a century ago.

So there are listings for Australian House, New Zealand House, South African House, New York House, Canadian House, Paris House and Belgium House.

Members from Paris House (10 of them), Sydney Office and New Zealand Office are amongst the fallen. French and Belgian staff were among 45 recipients of gallantry awards.

## The "unobtrusively" noble work of the Reckitt Nurses



This was the Services Division building in Dansom Lane shortly before it was demolished in 1991, little changed from Remembrance's WWI picture of it as the VAD (Voluntary Aid Detachment) Hospital - the Social Hall which the company converted and equipped with beds.



With typical understatement **Remembrance** reports: "During the whole period of the War, quite unobtrusively, a noble work was carried out at the premises of Messrs. Reckitts at Dansom Lane, which were converted into a comfortable and homely hospital." In the four years and three months 2,910 patients passed through the hospital, which was staffed by members of the Reckitts Nursing Division.

For his book Barrie Barnes was given (by her niece Mrs Brocklebank of Hull) this picture of Nurse Doris McGavin who worked at the factory from 1911 to 1955 and was a long serving, and much decorated, member of the Red Cross Society.

Known to the Night was virtually sold out on publication but when Contact spoke to Barrie this month he had, coincidentally, just come across an unopened pack of them. You can contact him on 01430 874089.

## We had the plaque - but not the office



When we did the Colman's WWI story for our last issue (No. 59, April) we had a picture of the London office memorial plaque but could not find, or recollect, one of the actual office. Ken Herbert eventually found this in one of the Colman family's privately published books.

An extract from *The Life of Geoffrey Colman* by John Gore: In 1914 Geoffrey began a world tour with Gilbert Talbot, son of the Bishop of Winchester. On the declaration of war his mother telegraphed the first port of disembarkation and on 8/8 received a wire from Geoffrey who told them he was re-embarking at once from Quebec. On the 15<sup>th</sup> he landed in England and joined the 7<sup>th</sup> Battalion of the Rifle Brigade, an officer of the new army. His war service proved to be short, it was curtailed by a German bullet in January 1916. It was not until May 9<sup>th</sup>, 1917 a medical board pronounced him fit for light duty and in September 1917 he received his definite release from the War Office. He died On March 18<sup>th</sup>, 1935. He was 43 years old.

## PHARMACEUTICALS DEMERGER PLAN

Four days after the Dansom Lane announcement the half year results gave the RB shares another boost with the plan to demerge RB Pharmaceuticals adding interest.

Rakesh Kapoor said: "We believe that RB Pharmaceuticals has the potential to deliver significant long term value creation as a stand-alone business. We have therefore decided to pursue a demerger of RB Pharmaceuticals with a separate UK listing.

"We expect this to take place over the next 12 months. This will also allow RB to focus on its core strategy to be a global leader in consumer health and hygiene."

The half year report says consumer health continues to deliver profitable growth and the Hygiene category improved after a slow start. Home performance was weak in challenging market conditions.

### Further efficiencies planned

The group has seen efficiencies in media planning and buying benefitting the first half. Further structural efficiencies in the second half and into next year will, with other programmes, continue to ensure an efficient platform to invest for future growth.

Mr. Kapoor said: "We believe market conditions will remain challenging in the second half of the year, particularly in the USA and certain emerging markets.

"Nonetheless we remain on track to achieve our full year total revenue growth target of 4-5%."

The company is forecasting continuing margin expansion in the second half.

# Good PR for regional and international growth and pension fund stability

**It was a classic public relations event. A government promoting regional development and a company pursuing international growth use a high-tech laboratory setting for a surprise photocall to announce a key £100m investment. Result – a top politician gets a good press and the company sees its share price soar.**

Chancellor of the Exchequer George Osborne was able to say: "RB plc is a great British success story and their decision to invest in the UK is testament to the steps this government has taken to make Britain open for business."

RB CEO, Rakesh Kapoor added: "Growing our global consumer health business is at the heart of our vision to provide innovative solutions for healthier lives and happier homes."

### Stakeholder satisfaction

As stakeholders RBPA members have the satisfaction of seeing continued success for the business which has been an important part of their lives plus, in the still uncertain economic climate, a welcome stimulus for their Pension Fund.

The £100m in RB's consumer health R&D operations will see the creation of a state of the art Centre

of Scientific Excellence to be based in Hull.

The detail of exact location and design is being finalised but we expect to show a drawing of the building and the Dansom Lane location in a forthcoming *Contact*.

One of six major RB R&D centres worldwide, the new UK centre will become the global technical innovation hub for products such as Nurofen and Strepsils.

The decision to locate the new Centre in the UK at the company's Hull site followed a review which considered RB's other R&D centre locations across the globe.

The decision reflects both the existing consumer health expertise in the UK and the UK Government's positive attitude towards encouraging innovation, science and technology.

## Red sails in the sunset again as Cambria returns to Carrow

Half a century ago the Thames sailing barge *Cambria* was a regular sight on Norwich's Carrow Works quayside as she brought mustard seed from Lincolnshire to Colman's mustard mill. A nostalgic return this month was not so simple. All the seven road and rail bridges between Great Yarmouth and Norwich had to open for the first time in years and both masts had to be lowered to pass under the A47 Southern bypass and reach the mooring opposite Read's Mill on Corporation Way near Carrow Bridge..

In their working lives *Cambria* and the 1898 wherry *Albion*, displayed with her, carried cargo to and from Read's Mill, which has now been converted to apartments. In addition to the mustard seed *Cambria* was involved in coastal trade between the River Thames, the Trent and the Humber and regularly brought soya bean, fertiliser and grain to Norwich mills in the 1940s and 1950s. Each year she is chartered by SeaChange, a charity providing youth training, who decided to re-establish Norwich's links with the sea by bringing the barge up the River Yare into the city.

When Jack joined in 1928 there were six men from his family, spanning three generations, working at Carrow. But the saga began more than 100 years earlier with Jack's maternal great-great-grandfather, John Wright.


### The mustard wagons

John Wright worked at Stoke Holy Cross, in charge of the wagons and horses which took the first Colman's mustard to London. His daughter Mary married a flour miller named Samuel Harrison.

Samuel began life as a miller at the tender age of 12. He joined Colmans at Stoke Holy Cross in 1837 and later became mill manager at Carrow, where he completed a total of 37 years with the company.

Two of Samuel and Mary's sons, Joseph and John, became carpenters

and they both worked at Carrow for 50 years. John was Jack's grandfather and his length of service was actually 53 years, 15 of them as foreman carpenter. He retired in 1918, having seen his three sons, Frank, Ted (Jack's father) and Bert follow in the family footsteps to Carrow.

Ted started as an apprentice electrician and, during the first World War, served in the Royal Field Artillery and Royal Flying Corps. He returned to Carrow in 1919 where he was promoted to foreman in 1927. A year later Jack followed his family tradition to start as an apprentice electrician and went on to complete 50 years' service.

**Norah Clarke** who has died at the age of 107 was the widow of a Chiswick employee and our oldest pensioner.


## His name is not on the memorial, but...



...like many others air mechanic George Temple, who worked for Colmans at Bethnal Green, was still a WWI victim. He joined the company straight from school when about 15 years of age and at the time of his death he was in the Royal Naval Air Service. He was taken on board H.M. Hospital Ship "Karapara" suffering from pneumonia and died on December 3rd, 1918, aged 21, and was buried in the cemetery at Mudros on the afternoon of December 5th. In this instance a 1919 house journal produced by a caring company has afforded recognition, but the media coverage of the centenary has revealed that many of the "missing" still are.

## FOREWORD.



**H**IS is a Remembrance record of our eleven hundred men who served in the Great War. In the hour of their Country's dire need they responded to the appeal for sacrificing service, and many of them laid down their lives. It is well that we should remember our debt to these, our fellow men, and cherish the memory of those who loved life even as we, but who gave all.

These are days of unrest, and the minds of men are possessed with fear. The War has altered the world profoundly, but we are too close to its mighty events to know or realize all that it has wrought and all that shall yet spring from it. We are suffering from its shock and overstrain, and its lessons are but partially understood. The Peace Treaty has left us disappointed and discouraged after our bright dreams of world settlement and the establishment of universal harmony and righteousness. We are passing through a testing time, but there is no need for panic fears. Our troubles are destined to pass. We have reached the end of an epoch, and we witness now the birth of a new time. The changes which bring uncertainty and unrest are yet charged with a new hope. The people that triumphed in the Great War are never fated to defeat in this strain and trial of a reconstructive time, if we stand together now as we did during the perils of war. Ours is the high task of making out of present turmoil and confusion a new age in which the righteousness that exalteth a nation shall be truly realized.

War is horrible and will become more horrible, more unthinkable, so that, as Mr. H. G. Wells says, unless it is ended it will certainly end human society. Unity must come, or else men will perish by their own inventions. This truth, at least, is becoming clearer in our minds.

The War will not have been entirely a thing of evil if its stupendous disaster is moving the minds of men further towards the spirit of "brotherhood, creative service, and self forgetfulness." The sense of it is even now spreading and increasing amongst us, let the signs of the hour be what they may. That spirit is of the things that abide and are eternal, but the trouble and evil of the time is transitory. It is hope, not despair, that is the ferment of these after days.

Within this, our own community serving under the name of Reckitts, we can manifest this spirit of helpful brotherliness and co-operation more and more, each of us by fulfilment of duty to God and fellow men, maintaining and developing the precious national heritage that has been saved by such as those to whom this record bears witness.



## Memorial Fountain.

On the previous page is shown a photograph of the model of the Memorial Fountain, erected by the Company in commemoration of employees who fell in the War.

The inscription reads :—





During the War, officials of the Boys' Club kept in touch with members in various ways. At Christmas parcels were sent out to them, and at intervals circular letters were written to all. In addition individual correspondence was carried on with about a hundred of the boys.

## Directors' Welcome to ex-Service Employees.



IX hundred of our demobilised soldiers and sailors sat down to a tea in the Francis Reckitt Institute on January 8th, 1920, at the invitation of the Directors.

A vote of thanks was proposed to the Directors for their kind generosity in having made the gift of over £8,000 to the ex-service men, also the allowances while on service, and parcels of food sent to prisoners of war.



## Disabled Men.



ALL our employees who served in the War were reinstated in their former positions if they were physically able to perform the duty, but the problem of the disabled soldier had to be dealt with. At Kingston, Morley Street, and Canister Works, the number of disabled ex-service men was 86, a percentage of 6.75. Employment of a lighter kind, suitable to the individual cases, was found for each man.

## EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTIONS.

During the War voluntary weekly deductions were made from the wages of men and girls, for the provision of parcels of foodstuffs, sweets and cigarettes, sent out to fellow employees every six or seven weeks. To non-smokers and men in hospital an equivalent in cash was sent.

Prisoners of War were also adopted.

From November, 1916, to April, 1919, the employees contributed £709 for parcels and cigarettes, and £176 for parcels to Prisoners of War, a total of £885.

The Christmas parcels sent out by the Company were packed by Forewomen and Helpers in their own time.

## LORD MAYOR OF HULL'S FUND FOR BLINDED SOLDIERS, SAILORS & CIVILIANS.

The total amount contributed by employees on behalf of the above Fund was £581, being made up of £443 from Kingston and Morley Street Works, and £138 from Canister Works.

## GIRLS' WORKING PARTY.

The Girls' Working Party consisted of Forewomen, Helpers and several girls from various rooms, who worked very hard in providing comforts for the men at the Front. The credit of forming the organisation is due to Miss M. Jones, the Head Social Worker. The work which was done at home, commenced in September, 1914, and was carried on to the end of 1918. The following is the record of work done during this period: 3,772 Sandbags, 1,240 Socks, 370 Scarves, 200 Shirts, 87 Belts, 424 Mittens, 138 Cuffs or Gloves, 59 Helmets.

## SPECIAL CONSTABLES & VOLUNTEERS, HULL.

96 of our men who were exempted from military service on account of age or indispensability, served as Special Constables. From April 12th, 1915, to August 5th, 1918, there were 49 air raid calls and eight air raid attacks.

63 of our employees also enlisted in Local Volunteer Regiments, the training for which was done during evenings and week-ends.

# RECKITT'S V.A.D. HOSPITAL.

THE fact that wounded soldiers and sailors coming to Hull asked particularly to be sent to Reckitt's V.A.D. Hospital, was a recommendation as to its efficient medical service and pleasing social character, which renders other comment almost superfluous.

During the whole period of the War, quite unobtrusively, a noble work was carried on at the premises of Messrs. Reckitts, in Dansom Lane, which were converted into a comfortable and homely hospital.

Mr. and Mrs. P. B. Reckitt were entirely responsible for the inauguration, and were ably assisted by a most efficient, hard-working and genial medical staff.

The Hospital was approved by the military authority in November, 1914, and the first patients were received on December 9th the same year. During the four years and three months, 2,910 patients passed through the hospital, which was ably staffed by members of the Reckitt's Nursing Division, assisted by members of the Hull St. John Ambulance Division. Mention should be made of the excellent service done by Mr. T. Guest (the chef), and his staff.

Mr. P. B. Reckitt, O.B.E., who took great interest in it, was Acting Commandant, and there is no doubt that the hospital was one of the most popular among the soldiers.

There were 45 beds, with a weekly average of 35 patients. The Matrons were first, Miss Tunnard, then Miss Cook, and finally Miss Evans, all assisted by Miss Varey who was there from start to finish.

Miss Cook and Miss Varey received the honour from the Government of the Royal Red Cross for services in hospital work. The medical staff consisted of Dr. J. Divine, J.P., Dr. J. L. Holt, Dr. A. Priest Shaw and Dr. J. H. Kaye (Medical Officer in Charge), Corporal A. Layfield throughout the four years acted as quartermaster. These officers were assisted by a large staff of voluntary nurses, to whom tribute must be paid for their long and constant devotion to duty.

Colonel J. W. Tatham, O.B.E. (Humber Garrison Medical Service), wrote :  
"The hospital itself and the way it has been managed has been of the greatest assistance, and I do not know how I should have carried on without it.

Throughout the time there has been no friction or trouble, and the patients who have been there greatly appreciate the care and kindness bestowed upon them. Many of them have told me they were so well looked after and received so many little extras and kindnesses that Reckitt's was the hospital that men wished to get into if they could. It hardly needs my assurance that a great work has been done for the military sick and wounded of the garrison, and that we are extremely grateful. I have always had pleasant recollections of the hospital and its organisation."

## The Johnstone-Reckitt Hospital.



Mr. Harold J. Reckitt, jointly with Lady Helen Johnstone, founded a Hospital at Ris Oranges, Seine-et-Oise. Though the services rendered by this Hospital were for the benefit of French soldiers, efforts were made for a period of four or five months before its establishment to place the Hospital with the British, either at Malta or Alexandria, but these efforts failed. It was eventually made a full French Military Hospital, the first in France to be so honoured.

Its X-Ray Department was one of the best equipped in France, and a number of important discoveries were made. The Hospital was equipped for 207 beds. During the three years it was running 2,400 patients passed through it. It specialised in fractures, more especially fractures of the leg and hip. A large Out-patients' Department for the civil population was run in connection with it.

Mr. Harold Reckitt was awarded the French Decoration of the Reconnaissance Francaise, 2nd Class.

## Reckitt's Nursing Division

Reckitt's Nursing Division was formed 12th July, 1912, Miss Hardy being appointed Lady Supt. and Dr. Wales, Hon. Surgeon. Our members were always enthusiastic, practising and studying how to make themselves efficient in First-Aid and Sick Nursing. All were members of the V.A.D.

Several of the older members helped at the Rest Station at Paragon Station for some time during the early part of 1915, but as the work at the Hospital grew, and the Air Raid alarms were frequent they were compelled, much to their regret, to give it up.

From the opening of our Social Hall as a V.A.D. Hospital in 1914 to its closing in January, 1919, much creditable work was done by the members during their leisure time, many doing night duty. Saturday and Sunday always found them busy in wards and kitchen.

The Air Raid work was perhaps the most creditable of all. Thirty-six of our members were stationed at the various Air Raid Stations in the city. They were unfailing in their duty, always turning out when the alarm sounded. An old member of the Hull Corps remarked to one of the Officers, that he "had never seen such 'stickers,' they were always ready with a cheery word and never complained of weariness, no matter how long the watch."

Ten Members have been awarded the S.J.A.B. War Badge as follows:—Miss E. M. Hardy, Miss H. R. Thackery, Mrs. E. M. Eggleton, Mrs. E. Backhurst, Miss H. Marshall, Miss E. Kirby, Miss L. Cullen, Miss E. Farrell, Miss E. Chalmers, Miss M. Westerman.

Four Members were accepted for Active Service as follows:—Miss Butler served at the East Leeds War Hospital for a short time, later she went on voyage on the Hospital Ship "Aquatania," finally working at Wandsworth Hospital, London.

Miss Jessie Barcroft was for a long time at Catterick Military Hospital, and was later transferred to Rouen, France.

Miss Lily Cullen helped in her spare time at Reckitt's Hospital during the first year, later was transferred to East Leeds War Hospital.

Miss Ellen Chalmers also helped at Reckitt's Hospital until she was appointed to East Leeds War Hospital.

## Record of Service by Men of RECKITT'S DIVISION of St. John Ambulance Brigade.

Prior to the formation of the Division on 27th July, 1912, Ambulance Classes had been held for many years and a large number of employees had qualified for First-Aid Certificates. The Division created a revival of interest amongst these Ambulance workers, and, at its inception, numbered 24 all ranks. All the uniforms and equipment were provided by the Firm.

Members turned out on numerous occasions on public duty connected with the Hull Corps, also at Reckitt's Sports, &c. In addition, valuable experience was gained in the treatment of accidents in the Works from time to time. Their records show that over 200 cases were treated during 1912/13.

On the outbreak of War, the strength of the Division had increased to 43, all of whom volunteered for service, and as the majority of the members were registered with the Home Hospital Reserve, the first draft of 18 N.C.O.'s and men were despatched to the Military Hospitals at Aldershot, Colchester, and Woking, on 8th August, 1914. Further drafts were sent later to other Military Hospitals in response to calls from the War Office through the St. John Brigade, and, subsequently, nearly all ranks were absorbed in one or other of the Reserves administered through the Brigade.

Whilst serving in the Home Hospitals, many volunteered for service abroad, and were eventually transferred to France, Salonika, Mesopotamia, &c.

Three Members of the Division who were not accepted for service with the Army, did creditable work in connection with local Air-Raids, and also V.A.D. transport duties.
